

SIERRA LEONE

Figure Analysis – Displacement Related to Conflict and Violence

CONTEXT

New displacements took recorded in Sierra Leone in 2018, for the first time in several years. About 3,000 people, mostly supporters of the main opposition All People's Congress (APC) party, were displaced from Kono district to Masingbi in northern part of the country. They fled political violence, which followed the presidential election in April 2018.¹

NEW DISPLACEMENTS

This corresponds to new instances of internal displacement having occurred in 2018.

Sources and methodologies

IDMC based its estimate of the number of people newly displaced in the country in 2018 on reports from the Anadolu News Agency, which cites Caritas. We triangulated this estimate with local news sources including the Sierra Express Media.

Main caveats and monitoring challenges

The Anadolu and Sierra Express Media figures are not identical. IDMC believes the former's figures are more reliable, because its report provides more detail about the condition of the IDPs. No further information is available on the methodology employed by Caritas.

IDMC figure and rationale

More than 3,000 people were displaced in April 2018 in Kono district, triggered by post-electoral violence. IDMC's figure is taken from reports from Anadolu News Agency, triangulated with local news sources including Sierra Express Media.

Significant changes from last year

This is the first time IDMC has reported on conflict displacement in Sierra Leone.

TOTAL NUMBER OF IDPS

This corresponds to the total number of individuals living in internal displacement as of 31 December 2018.

Sources and methodologies

IDMC used data from the Turkish Anadolu Agency, which covered the crisis, citing the Caritas assessment as the source of its figures. IDMC triangulated these figures using local news sources, including the Sierra Express Media.

Main caveats and monitoring challenges

The figures reported by Anadolu Agency (3,000 people) and Sierra Express Media (2,000), conflict with one another. IDMC decided to use the Anadolu Agency figure because its article provides more detailed information about the condition of the IDPs and we therefore consider it likely to be more accurate. No further information is available on the methodology employed by Caritas.

IDMC figure and rationale

IDMC does not have further information about whether the 3,000 displaced people were able to return home. Consequently, we consider them all to still be displaced.

Significant changes from last year

This is the first time IDMC has reported on conflict displacement in Sierra Leone.



CONFIDENCE ASSESSMENT

The Confidence Assessment provides an at-a-glance overview of the comprehensiveness of the data available regarding displacement associated with conflict for each country. It describes the methodologies used, frequency of reporting, data disaggregation and geographical coverage. Here two key metrics are analysed: the new displacements and the total number of IDPs.
